
# More Options in Enrichment Year \_\_\_\_\_







#### Reorganise the system blocks



#### Create an Enrichment Year in 3<sup>rd</sup> year

Reduce classroom-based Common Core Course requirements from  $\bf 6$  to  $\bf 3$  courses only

Redeploy the current Elective Semester

Merge and move Integrated Block-A with Integrated Block-B to the beginning of Year 4

Reorganise and Integrate some systems blocks as above

(No net reduction in what is currently being taught)

#### What are the opportunities & challenges?

#### **Challenges**

The whole timetable, including dissection sessions, will have to be rearranged

Finding enough student overseas placements

Creating an interactive e-portfolio to monitor students' progress while they are away

Not all students would wish to pursue an additional degree or to travel abroad

Finding enough supervisors to offer MRes(Med) or other research internships
