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PolyU 4-Year Undergraduate Degree Structure

- *Minimum* credit requirement: **120 credits**
 - General University Requirement (GUR) [30 credits]
 - Major Study [66-102 credits]
 - Free Electives/Minor Study [Remaining credits]

PolyU General University Requirement

 30-credit General University Requirement (GUR) consists of <u>6</u> <u>components</u>:

 Academically rigorous for expanding students' intellectual capacity. These subjects introduce a particular discipline, covering its foundational presuppositions, the structure of its knowledge domain, its approach of enquiry and study methodologies, as well as its major trends of development.

Freshman Seminar – 3 credits

- Introduce students to the discipline/profession and enthuse them about their potential major;
- Cultivate their higher order thinking skills;
- Encourage their entrepreneurship; and
- Help them learn to engage in self-directed and autonomous study.



Language and Communication Requirement (LCR) – 9 credits

- Aims to help students become an effective communicator by developing their language competence for academic and professional needs.
- All students are required to take 9 credits of LCR subjects, including English (6 credits) and Chinese (3 credits).
- Additional language requirements 'Reading and Writing Requirements' in both English and Chinese are embedded in the CAR subjects for further development of literacy skills.
- Major study a minimum of 4-credit discipline-specific language requirements (2 credits in English & 2 credits in Chinese).

Language & Communication Requirements

Leadership & Intra-Personal Development – 3 credits

- Aims to prepare students to lead themselves and others.
- Enabling students to:
 - understand theories and research on the intra-personal and interpersonal qualities of effective leaders;
 - develop self-awareness and a better understanding of oneself;
 - acquire interpersonal skills essential for functioning as an effective leader; and
 - develop self-reflection skills.



Leadership & Intra-Personal Development

Cluster Area Requirement (CAR) – 12 credits

- Aims to expand students intellectual capacity beyond disciplinary domains and to enable them to tackle professional and global issues from a multidisciplinary perspective.
- Includes broader range of academic subjects that use different paradigms, theoretical perspectives and methods of enquiry across the 4 cluster areas.



Cluster Area Requirement (CAR) – 12 credits (Cont'd)

- Three attributes embedded in some CAR subjects (and students need to fulfill for graduation)
 - China Studies to help students understand aspects of Chinese culture, history and contemporary developments.
 - English Writing and Reading to further enhance students' proficiency in English.
 - Chinese Writing and Reading to further enhance students' proficiency in Chinese.



Service Learning – 3 credits

- Aims to help students develop into a competent professional with a heart to serve others.
- Students to:
 - Apply the knowledge & skills they acquired from university learning to deal with complex issues in the service setting;
 - Reflect on the roles and responsibilities both as a professional in their chosen discipline and as a responsible citizen; and
 - Develop a stronger empathy for people in need and a stronger sense of civic responsibility.



Healthy Lifestyle – non-credit bearing

- Aims to help students acquire the basic knowledge and skills to maintain a healthy lifestyle and the quality of life by improving their physical well-being.
- Students will be able to:
 - Develop an individual approach to maintain physical, emotional and social well-being via exercise/sport participation;
 - Acquire the basic knowledge of risk factors and safety issues for exercise and daily life; and
 - Acquire the basic knowledge and the importance of maintaining a well-balanced diet.



PolyU Articulation Degree Programmes

- Minimum credit requirement: 60 credits
 - Including the mandatory reduced GUR curriculum of <u>9 credits</u>.



- Student <u>not</u> meeting the equivalent standard of the Language & Communication Requirement (LCR) will be required to take additional LCR subjects.
- <u>No</u> further credit transfer for the required GUR subjects.

PolyU Senior Year Intakes to Undergraduate Degree Programmes

- Minimum credit requirement: 60 credits
 - Including the mandatory reduced GUR curriculum.



- Student <u>not</u> meeting the equivalent standard of the Language & Communication Requirement (LCR) will be required to take additional LCR subjects.
- <u>No</u> further credit transfer for the required GUR subjects.

- Admittees will be assessed according to guidelines developed by the University language units.

Students with an appropriate Higher Diploma or Associate Degree from a recognised institution can be considered for senior year admission to our full-time government funded Bachelor's degree or for admission to our articulation degree programmes.

Other students may also be admitted with appropriate recognition of their past study and take fewer credits if they possess advanced admission qualifications above the Hong Kong Diploms of Secondary Education Examination (e.g., holders of HKALE/GCEALE/IB qualifications. HD/AD graduates not offered places through the senior year admission route or students studying Bachelor's degree programmes).

- The University has stipulated policies on credit transfer for admission with advanced standing as follows:
- The number of credits which a student is required to complete for the award concerned will be determined by the Programme host department at the time of admission, and no later than the end of the add/drop period.

2. Students. who upon admission wish to apply for further transfer of credits from their previous studies, and take fewer credits than those confirmed at the time of admission, will have to follow the arrangements for 'application for credit transfer' and to pay the related fees. The credits to be transferred are subject to the rules governing credit transfer including the maximum credits allowed and the validity period for subject credits.
